CASUAL VACANCY

At the recent council meeting held on the 11th August 2009, the council accepted the resignation of councilor Ian Tonge leaving a vacancy to be filled please find below a formal public notice:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that due to the *resignation of Ian Tonge*, a casual vacancy has arisen in the Office of Parish Councillor for the Town Council.

If by *Wednesday, 9th September 2009* (14 days* after the date of this notice), a request for an election to fill the said vacancy is made in writing to the Returning Officer at Pittwood House, Ashby Road, Scunthorpe, North Lincolnshire, DN16 1AB, signed by TEN electors for the said Town, an election will be held to fill the said vacancy, otherwise the vacancy will be filled by co-option.

The election will take place not later than *Thursday, 12th November 2009*.

MANOR PARK PLAYING FIELD

Manor Park Playing Field continues to make progress towards a thorough refurbishment in keeping with the wishes of the community. The management group has all its executive officers in place and also has the requisite number of trustees. The immediate task is to design a consultation exercise to cover all age groups in the town including residents whose properties adjoin the playing field; the views expressed through consultation will determine how the refurbishment proceeds and help in the process of acquiring funding.

LIVE RESPONDERS

Have you ever wondered how you might help in the event of an emergency? An organisation called **Live Responders** is establishing a group in Crowle and Ealand; members will receive training in coping with emergencies in conjunction with the emergency services. Anyone interested is invited to attend meetings held at the Lock, Stock and Barrel at Cross Street on Tuesday's at 7.30pm. Four members have already enrolled and have the potential to provide an indispensable service to the community.

ALLOTMENTS

After an initial survey over 30 people have requested an Allotment, several sites for allotments have been identified in Crowle and Ealand and the next step is to seek advice on how to proceed from the officer responsible for such matters at North Lincolnshire Council. Thanks are due to the members of the Gardening Club who raised the issue of allotments for local residents.

Thanks and congratulations are due to **7 Lakes** and the **Fire Service** for arranging the Raft Race which attracted lots of visitors and was a welcome attraction to the people of Crowle and Ealand.
